Overnight Youth Worker Fulfills Dream Helping Youth

Oloruntoyin's journey to supporting youth began with his own early challenges. After losing his mother at 11, he learned independence and resilience, vowing to help others navigate tough times.

A teacher in Nigeria before immigrating to Canada, Oloruntoyin studied youth addiction and mental health and worked with agencies supporting young people. One transformative overnight shift at Eva's Satellite confirmed his calling.

Black Mental Health Matters

How Eva's Creates Safe, Culturally Inclusive Spaces for Healing



Homelessness is difficult for any young person, but for Black youth, systemic racism and discrimination add extra challenges. These barriers limit youth's access to education, housing, and work, while also increasing their risk of mental health struggles.

Eva's is breaking these barriers with culturally responsive programs that address the unique mental health needs of Black youth. "Culture plays a significant role in how health care is received and provided. Being Black adds another layer of challenges," explains Natalie Smith, Eva's Manager of Program Development and Partnerships.

Through partnerships with Inner City Health Associates (ICHA) and The Thriving Roots Wellness Collective Group, Eva's provides access to psychiatrists and Black psychotherapists. For newcomer and refugee youth, life-skills programs help ease the stress of adapting to new systems and communities.

During Black Mental Health Week (March 2 – 9), Eva's partnered with Taibu Community Health Centre and CAFCAN to host activities like Socasize workouts and haircare workshops. These programs celebrated selfcare and cultural identity.

"Haircare reflects self-esteem and identity, and physical activity boosts mood and reduces stress," Natalie adds.

By providing culturally relevant care, programs like this foster belonging and stability for Black youth to overcome challenges.

When individuals don't see themselves reflected in mental health professionals, it can be harder to seek support. That's why Eva's prioritizes targeted mental health supports year-round.

"I fell in love with Eva's that night," he shared.

Now a full-time overnight youth worker at Eva's Satellite, Oloruntoyin arrives with a warm smile and an open heart, offering stability and comfort during the challenging nighttime hours at the emergency shelter. He focuses on building trust through small, meaningful interactions.

"At night, someone might need to talk, and I'm always there. It's about understanding who the young people are and supporting them through their challenges," he explained.

Oloruntoyin's goal is to be a trusted, dependable presence for all the youth at Satellite. His work

is instrumental in creating a sense of safety and belonging for young people facing instability.

Thanks to dedicated staff like Oloruntoyin, youth at Eva's gain the guidance and support they need to stabilize their lives and work toward brighter futures.

We serve 86 youth each night across our two emergency shelters.
